
### Joining Ashlyns 👿

Transition from primary school to secondary school is often described as 'a big step'. However, at Ashlyns students are well supported and this is the beginning of exciting new opportunities, meeting new people and broadening horizons.

Our carefully planned transition process helps students to settle in quickly and become part of the Ashlyns family. We gather detailed knowledge of new students, and our staff work closely with their previous schools to ensure we understand each individual joining Ashlyns.

Our current students are an integral part of our transition process and are on hand to offer assistance to new students so that they are welcomed and supported by their peers.

Our three day residential visit to the Peak District early in the Autumn term of Year 7 cements new friendships, strengthens tutor group identity and provides memories that last a lifetime. All students become a member of one of our four Houses, providing them with a sense of belonging and broadening their friendship circle as they meet their fellow House members, including those from different year groups. Throughout the year, there are many opportunities to gain House points and the competition for the House Cup at the end of the year is hotly contested! The dedicated Year 7 transition team ensures that every child feels able to settle in quickly and knows they belong to our community. 

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## **Curriculum & Learning**

The curriculum at Ashlyns is designed to be broad, balanced and inspiring; this helps to develop students who are confident, articulate, resilient, socially-responsible citizens of the future. We offer a strong core curriculum supplemented by exciting options and opportunities within, and beyond, the classroom; further details of our curriculum can be found on the school website.



At Key Stage 3, students study a comprehensive range of subjects, providing a foundation for their success at Key Stage 4 and in the Sixth Form. This is enhanced by:

- Extended Learning Days including off-site trips and visiting speakers, mock employment interviews, student wellbeing workshops, international days and House challenges.
- a carousel of exciting curriculum enrichment options in Year 9, such as Marginal Gains, Digital Photography, Astronomy, Business Entrepreneurship, and many more.

Our Key Stage 4 provision offers a predominantly academic suite of GCSEs, supplemented by alternative courses such as BTECs and a bespoke project qualification course, tailored to students' needs and choices. We recognise the importance of making the right subject choices. Our staff work with students to ensure the subjects they choose to study are tailored to their aspirations and strengths, and link these to their relevance and application in later life.

We are delighted that so many of our students join our Sixth Form and progress onto many of the country's top universities. Please see our Sixth Form prospectus for more information.

Students are given the tools to navigate, challenge and contribute to an everchanging and complex world through our PSHE and enrichment programmes. This means they can keep themselves healthy, safe and happy. We provide a comprehensive package of visiting speakers and experts to provide guidance on topics such as mental wellbeing, safe relationships, digital footprints and online safety. This helps to ensure that school is relevant in light of contemporary issues and the future.

Our students are digital natives and we support them in becoming responsible users of technology, to harness the benefits of digital technology in the classroom and to prepare them for life beyond school. Students joining Ashlyns have their learning enhanced by use of Google Suite for Education on individual Chromebooks.

# **Pastoral Care & Wellbeing**

Pastoral care at Ashlyns is excellent and is built upon the principle that 'the children's needs come first'. *In today's complex world, young people need quidance more than ever on how to keep themselves safe* and happy; at Ashlyns, you can be confident that we nurture the skills, resilience and character that young people need to thrive in the modern world.

The PSHE curriculum is supplemented by a comprehensive and wide range of exciting and expert talks along with dedicated, timetabled days: these cover vital discussions such as healthy living, safe relationships, the online community and protecting your digital footprint, growth mindset, careers advice, addiction, crime and mental wellbeing. Regular guidance and advice is also provided, in parallel to these sessions, to parents.

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Your children's wellbeing is safeguarded and nurtured through:

- the Form Tutor the first point of contact for you and your child
- the Head of Year and Safeguarding and Pastoral Officer for the year group
- the School Matron, who is on hand every day for advice and concerns
- the Safeguarding Team
- the Inclusion Team

Each child is guided and supported throughout their time at the school, helping to ensure that every student feels happy, confident and a valued member of our community.

Our highly experienced Inclusion Department is part of the transition team; their involvement ensures that the correct assistance is put in place to give targeted support where necessary, so that every child knows that they matter and are valued.

Opportunities for developing students' understanding of how to stay safe



are successfully threaded through the curriculum. These are found in assemblies, tutorial periods and lessons throughout the school. This includes helping students to deal with any risks they may routinely face, including the use of the internet and social media. Students and parents say that students feel very safe at the school. Students are very confident that there are adults at school they can talk to if they need advice and that the school will deal effectively with any concerns they report.

### Sixth Form

The vast majority of students continue their studies in our vibrant and successful Sixth Form. High expectations from the outset help to prepare them for the next stage of education and/or future employment. Our aim is that they should leave us as confident, well-rounded, independent individuals who are ready to meet the demands of our modern world.



Making the transition from GCSE to A level is challenging and we ensure our students are fully supported in making the best choices prior to starting their studies in the Sixth Form. In Year 11, students meet with a member of the Senior Leadership Team and benefit from expert advice and guidance on the range, relevance and choice of subjects they wish to study. Our Sixth Form curriculum offers a broad range of A Level choices, which can extend the subject learning they have enjoyed at GCSE as well as providing the chance to study new subjects. The academic programme of study delivered alongside the VESPA

Mindset programme enables students to develop the necessary cognitive and non-cognitive skills that promote educational success.

We take a holistic approach to our students' progress providing, in addition to their academic studies, a wealth of opportunities for them to further develop the values that are an integral part of the Ashlyns community. Through our extra-curricular programmes we provide students with additional opportunities to further develop integrity, independence and inclusivity. As role models for the lower school they are encouraged to take part in community activities, taking up leadership and mentoring roles as well as developing the social skills that are essential for employment and university. We set high standards for our senior students and are proud that they are such confident and exemplary role models for others.

Independent learning is at the forefront of success at A Level. To facilitate this, our Sixth Formers enjoy their own

standalone block which includes quiet study areas and a separate Sixth Form cafe with inside and outside eating facilities. Our Learning Resource Centre is also available for study and provides a variety of Sixth Form specific reading materials.

Experienced tutors and a dedicated Safeguarding and Pastoral Officer are proactive in supporting, motivating and guiding students through these vital two years of study. This helps to ensure our high expectations are realised and that students are resilient and independent learners, able to perform at a high level, with a positive work ethic and self-reliant attitude.

Students appreciate the expert advice and preparation they receive regarding university entry and the majority of our Sixth Formers go on to higher education, including the most prestigious universities within the Russell Group such as Oxford and Cambridge and with top ranking companies as part of the Degree Apprenticeship Programme.





## Learning Beyond the Classroom

A wide and varied programme of extra-curricular activities is crucial to our ethos of developing the whole person, inspiring students, and helping them to achieve their potential. Students are encouraged to express themselves through sport, music, drama, technology and outdoor pursuits, and to develop leadership skills in our extensive student leadership programme.







Our outstanding facilities, including an impressive sports hall, state of the art gym, pump track, dojo and astroturf pitch, as well as specialist drama studios and music practice rooms, encourage students to develop skills across a variety of different areas. Productions in drama, concerts in music and frequent fixtures in sport provide excellent opportunities for our students and community to celebrate and enjoy their skills.

Our extremely popular Learning Resource Centre is a hub of creativity and is pivotal in encouraging extra-curricular reading through a rich programme of events and activities. These include visits from award-winning authors, the popular 'Book Bake-Off' plus Harry Potter and murder mystery evenings. In addition, students can participate in lunchtime quizzes, creative writing and drawing competitions and literary digital escape rooms. Students also take part in the Carnegie Medal book shadowing and the Royal Society Young People's book prize.

Ashlyns offers a wide range of opportunities that promote independence and learning in the wider sense. Students are encouraged to participate in competitions such as the Rotary Challenges in Technology and Maths, Youth Speaks and the Young Chef Award. Every year our students develop their research and presentation skills in the charity First Give competition as well as taking part successfully in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme. Alongside a wide variety of curriculum based trips, we offer further opportunities such as the World Challenge expeditions, last year to Vietnam, as well as the popular biennial ski trip.

Clubs and extra-curricular activities help to lay the foundations of future successful and responsible citizenship, and we encourage students to be involved in local groups and community projects, such as the Swan Youth Centre, Berkhamsted Raiders Community Football Club, and Rush Judo.

Students help raise funds for many charities through their House, where they have the opportunity to nominate and promote their own favoured charity, and through the First Give project. Charity work is close to the hearts of many of our students and they are involved in a variety of ways with organisations such as the Hospice of St Francis and the Wamba Community Trust.

### Leadership & Community

At Ashlyns, we believe that all students have tremendous potential to make a positive difference, not only to benefit themselves, but also to benefit their school, local and wider communities.

Our students are encouraged to play a pivotal role in school and community life; we consider this a vital part of developing our core values of integrity, inclusivity and independence. Student Voice plays a central part in the life of the school and we encourage our young people to take an active role in the Student Leadership Team and their House leadership. The Student Leadership team is led by our Head Students and representatives from the Sixth Form Executive, who also play an extremely active part in Sixth Form operations and strategy. Leadership Committees cover a range of areas including the EcoGroup and Equalities Group.

The opinions of students are essential to the school's development, and regular focus groups of students from across the school take place to gather their views on a range of issues including: teaching and learning, behaviour, home-learning and safeguarding, as well as school improvement planning. The Ashlyns School Sports Leaders and the Learning Ambassador programmes play a fundamental role in developing the leadership skills of our students. Our Sports Leaders represent Ashlyns around the school and wider community at a variety of events, including Sports Days and Community days.

Our team of dedicated and highly skilled KS3 Learning Ambassadors deliver lessons across Berkhamsted primary schools in a variety of subjects. Each learning ambassador visits at least three primary schools per year and are wholly responsible for delivering their lessons to small groups of primary school children. Both the Sports Leader and Learning Ambassador programmes develop confidence, independence and core skills that our students can take forward through school and life. Parents and carers play a fundamental part in their child's learning and our wider community. Our Parent Forum is open to parents from all year groups and has been influential in informing development on issues such as home learning, careers, attendance, and our extra-curricular programme, amongst many others. Parent Forum feedback also forms an integral part of our school improvement planning each year.

Ashlyns is proud of its heritage dating back to the 18th century. Our journey began when a retired sea captain, Thomas Coram. became concerned about the number of unwanted children wandering the streets of London and campaigned for a hospital to be built to accommodate them. In 1739 he was granted a Royal Charter and the hospital was established at Lamb's Conduit Fields, Bloomsbury, in 1742.

The Hospital Governors decided to relocate to a healthier environment outside London in 1926. The children were relocated to Redhill, whilst our magnificent Georgian-style buildings, based on the original hospital, were completed in 1935. Many features from the original hospital can be found in the school such as the stained glass in the Chapel, the beautiful staircase in the entrance hall and the carved fireplace in the Board Room.

In 1951, Hertfordshire County Council took responsibility for the educational element of the Hospital, and it was renamed Ashlyns School. The Coram Foundation phased out boarders in 1955, when the Foundation sold the buildings to the County Council. The living accommodation was converted into classrooms and laboratories, and a 'grammar' stream was added to the school, making Ashlyns the first bilateral school in Hertfordshire.

By 1972, Ashlyns School had become a comprehensive upper school, forming part of the three-tier system of education which operated in Berkhamsted. 2013 heralded a new chapter in our history as we welcomed back students from the age of 11 to become a secondary school again.

Our staff and students are proud and conscious of their historic surroundings and we have close links with the Coram Foundation (www.coram.org.uk).

#### Governance

Since joining this vibrant community, I have had the pleasure of seeing the school go from strength to strength. The school has had a significant investment in and expansion of its facilities and infrastructure, as well as continued improvements in examination performance for GCSE and A level students.

The governors act as a corporate body and have statutory responsibilities to ensure the school meets its legal requirements whilst also making strategic decisions and providing suitable challenge to the Headteacher in order to keep the school moving forward. As a Foundation School, the Ashlyns Board has additional responsibilities regarding the school finances, as the employer and as custodian of the school site.

Our most recent inspection in September 2023 confirmed the school's significant strengths alongside the "positive and purposeful atmosphere in which pupils learn". Perhaps most importantly it also noted that "pupils are proud of their school and appreciate the teamwork between staff and pupils that helps them reach for the highest levels of success".

As governors, we are dedicated to school improvement and are proud to work with the staff, students, parents/carers and the community to ensure Ashlyns builds on its successes to provide an excellent guality of education. Our aim is simple - to provide an environment where students feel proud, happy and safe – one where they are stimulated and are provided with a platform for a successful future. #### Admissions
