Component 1: Devising Portfolio

The students have currently completed their devising performance in Year 10 and the first draft of their portfolio. However, the final submission of this portfolio is **Friday 28th February.**

Students should be using the feedback given my Miss Hill and myself to ensure they are making the progress to support their final mark for this component.

It is worth 40% of the GCSE - so it is imperative that students are focused on making this the most developed it can be. We are running the invited Wednesday After School sessions (every student is invited - but has been given specific dates.)





Component 2: Scripted Performance

This part of the course is worth 20% of the GCSE.

Students will perform their scripted performances on March 6th.

Students need to ensure that they have:

- Learnt their lines for both extracts
- Confident in the character that they are playing
- Have clear and confident blocking of scenes
- Students are able to attend rehearsals in DR1 any lunchtime / after school





The Written Exam

It is split into **two sections.** Students have **1hr 45 mins** to complete this paper, unless they have additional time. The exam paper will cover:

<u>Section 1 : The Crucible</u> - Students will be asked questions about the play from an actors, directors and designers point of view.

<u>Section 2 : Live Theatre Evaluation</u> - This will be based on a piece of theatre that students have seen. They will be asked 2 questions about this performance. One will ask students to **analyse** the other to **evaluate**.





The Crucible Questions

Section A (2 Questions) : i - 4 marks ii - 6 marks As a performer

Section B (2 Questions) : i - 9 marks ii - 12 marks As a director

Section C (1 Question) : - 14 marks As a designer

Students are given an extract to make direct links from, but will also need to make reference to context and wider play in Section B & C.





Revision Requirements for The Crucible

- Knowledge of the Play
- Creative choices as a director/designer/actor
- Context of the play
- Clear idea of structure of questions and timings.





Revision Website

These are optional but even if students just want to complete practise questions, they can.

- Reverse side: Costume ideas for character


